As one of the oldest settlements in Australia as well as one of the world's top travel destinations, **Sydney** offers Aussie hospitality combined with spectacular attractions -- from its dramatic harbour and cosmopolitan city center, to its protected coves, miles of beautiful beaches, and the spectacular Blue Mountains. The brightest star in the Southern Hemisphere and is home to one quarter of Australia's residents and the financial, and cultural heart of the country. Sailing in and out of Sydney harbour is one of the world's great maritime moments.

Hobart is Australia's second oldest city and state capital of Tasmania. Home to more than 90 National Trust buildings, Hobart combines colonial character with a metropolitan lifestyle. It is the gateway to Tasmania's other scenic attractions and a range of shore activities lets you experience the best of both worlds.

Fifteen thousand years ago, glaciers carved out **Fiordland National Park**. Witness what nature perfected over time — its snowcapped mountains, roaring rivers filled with ice and the lush green grasslands that blanket this famed wilderness landscape in southwest New Zealand.



Milford Sound ~ The largest and most complex of the many fjords along this coast, with steep-sided cliffs and hundreds of cascading waterfalls.

Doubtful Sound ~ Situated within Fiordland National Park, part of the Te Wahipounamu World Heritage Site and surrounded by sheer rocks and lush forests.

Dusky Sound ~ An unusual sound with two distinct layers of water: fresh mountain water atop cold, heavy, saline water teeming with remarkable deep-sea species.

Dunedin is the old Gaelic name for Edinburgh. Uncover this "kiwi" city's Scottish heritage roots as you meander its octagon-shaped streets and quaint Victorian buildings.

Christchurch has a rich history of adventurers who used Christchurch as a gateway for Antarctic explorations. Famed explorers Robert Falcon Scott and Ernest Shackleton used the port of Lyttelton as a departure point for their expeditions.



Wellington city's focal point is undoubtedly the harbor, one of the world's best protected and the world's most beautiful. Flooding of a very large, long extinct volcano crater formed Wellington's harbor. Since Wellington lies in the path of the only major gap in New Zealand's central mountain range, the city has earned its nickname of Windy Wellington

Lying on sweeping Hawkes Bay, **Napier** is a fascinating city, architecturally rich, blessed with a fine coastal position and is known for its fruit growing and wine vineyards. Today Napier is known as the Art Deco capital of the world. Napier and its neighbor city, Gisborne, are the first urban areas to see the sun rise on 1st January of each New Year.

The "Bay of Plenty" was named by Captain Cook after the prosperous Maori villages of the region generously replenished his supplies. **Tauranga**, the chief city, is a bustling port, an agricultural and timber center and a popular seaside resort. Tauranga is the gateway to Rotorua, a geothermal wonderland that is the heart of Maori culture and New Zealand's primary tourist attraction.



While in **Auckland** shop along the picturesque waterfront of this ever-expanding city, home to one-third of the country's population. From museums housing Maori artifacts to extinct volcanic peaks, this pedestrian-friendly city is the perfect combination of nature and commerce.
